

Supplies that make foundation paper piecing easier:

- 17 lb. clear-translucent-Vellum paper (jampaper.com) 50 sheets @ \$10
- Add-A-Quarter Ruler (\$9 - \$19 on Amazon)
- Elmer's disappearing purple glue stick
- Card stock strip, credit card or my business card
- Tweezers (flat and pointed)
- Seam ripper
- Small Spray Bottle
- Iron
- Scotch Brand Invisible tape (stands up to heat slightly better than cheap tape)
- Light box (good for matching registration lines) \$10 to \$40 on Amazon

Removing paper from the finished section:

- Pinch the end of the seam at the beginning to keep stitching from coming out.
- Rip along the seam, not away from the seam.
- Sometimes it's helpful to remove the paper in reverse number order.
- If paper remains in the seam, dampen the thread with water and a Qtip.
- If the paper sticks to glued areas, spritz the front lightly with water.
- Use the tip of your seam ripper to lift the edge of the paper
- Use the backside of the point of the seam ripper to score the seam.

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
